American Association for the Study of Liver Disease	<p>Creation of Disease Registry Software Platform</p> <p>AASLD is soliciting requests for proposals from vendors to build, host, and maintain a disease registry software platform that supports the Learning Health Network. The goal of the system is to enroll patients from multiple sites into a single platform with minimal manual data entry. Among other things, the system needs to extrapolate discrete data from an EHR (for example, lab values, pharmacy and vital signs); convert narrative data to discrete data via Smart Notes or similar application; support manual data entry via a Web-based patient portal; collate data into dashboards at the center level that can be used for population management; support a national network with multiple sites to identify variations in care, high performing sites, and promulgate best practices; support longitudinal patient data and allow tracking over time at the patient level; and provide support for research data needed by the pharmaceutical industry (no interface to pharma companies needed).</p> <p>This is a three-year contract, after which time the contract may either be extended or the platform is moved to a hosting site of AASLD's choosing (no proprietary technologies).</p>	04-27-2018
